RE: **ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT**
"NOTICE TO BUILDING OCCUPANTS AND PARENTS"

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) requires that each year schools notify parents, teachers, and students in writing of the availability of Management Plans for asbestos materials identified in each school. Pursuant to Section 763.93(e)(12)(g)(4), this notice shall be dated and identified by school/facility affiliation.

The most acceptable form of notification is to have the notice included in the school newsletter. A copy of the text for this notice is attached (see attachment). Make sure to insert the name of your school in the space indicated.

Please issue the notice as suggested and include a copy of the notice in your Asbestos Management Plan. A copy of the newsletter should also be sent to John Boucher, Facility Operations and Safety Manager. If possible, send an electronic copy by email.

Asbestos Notification to Occupants

NOTICE TO BUILDING OCCUPANTS
AND PARENTS

NOTIFICATION OF INSPECTION FOR ASBESTOS CONTAINING
MATERIALS IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has issued a final rule, 40 CFR Part 763, Asbestos Containing Material in schools, commonly referred to as AHERA. This rule requires all Local Education Agencies (LEA's) to identify asbestos containing materials (ACM) in their school buildings and to take appropriate actions to control the release of asbestos fibers.

All inspections for Longleaf have been completed and a Management Plan describing the results of the inspection and the action plan to control any asbestos found during the inspection, where applicable, has been submitted to the Governor for approval. A copy of this plan is located in the administrative office of this school and at the District School Board of Pasco County Maintenance & Facility Services Department and is available for review upon request.
